2. Main Routes

3. ALL OTHER STREETS

All other streets will be plowed as quickly as possible, working our way out of town to plow the roads along the highway.

4. SIDEWALKS

The Village of Fruitvale will clean the following sidewalks:

Columbia Gardens From Beaver Street to Walnut

Main Street from BV Manor to Post Office

Intersection of Kootenay Avenue and Main Street

Island and portion of sidewalk adjacent to Lot 5 on the curve.

Liberty to Hall

Around Hall

Village Office parking lot

All Village owned properties

Lane behind Liberty property

Railway crossing

All other sidewalks are to be done by the respective property owners or tenant, and if they are not done within 24 hours of the snow fall, they will be done by the Village crew or a contractor and the respective property owner will be involved.

5. HYDRANTS

Hydrants will be cleared as expediently as possible.

6. PARKING

All cars/vehicles are to be off the street from 5:00 a.m to 4:00 pm to allow for effective snow removal operations. Any cars/vehicles impeding snow removal will be towed away at the owner's expense.

7. SALTING

Salt is used mainly in a salt/sand mixture, with temperatures above -4 to avoid ice buildup. Straight salt could be used on occasion to remove ice buildup or to prevent icing

8. PLOWING

Standard procedure is to plow the snow equally to the left and the right. This procedure may have to be varied on certain streets.

9. RETURN OF SNOW TO STREETS

When the Village has plowed a street and a property owner returns snow to the street from their driveway; if the Village is required to go back to that street to plow it again, then the property owner will be invoiced for costs.

10. LEVEL OF SERVICE

The Village does not support a bare pavement policy. The streets and sidewalks will not necessarily be bare, but the ice and snow will be kept to a minimum, based on equipment and manpower capabilities.

11. EMERGENCY VEHICLES

If at anytime that an emergency vehicle cannot access any property due to vehicles parked on the street, the vehicles will be towed away with out notice and at the owner's expense.

\*Note:

This will be known as the standard procedure, but there are circumstances in which this procedure cannot be followed exactly and therefore will be altered for reasons of safety or some other item which is beyond our control.
